

Summary of November 7, 2022 Meeting

The meeting was called to order by President Joe Howes at 7:30 PM. He led the members in the Pledge of Allegiance, and welcomed guests.

Secretary: The minutes from the October meeting were emailed out, as well as printed out and circulated before the meeting. The minutes of the board meeting, have been printed out, and are up front for review.

Treasurer: Roy Kamps reported that we have \$88,969.00 dollars in the general fund. Everything is paid.
